ACTS

History

DESCRIPTION OR MEANING:

The Early Church

"You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Acts 1:8b

Acts is the final historical book of the New Testament. The rest of the books are Pauline letters and Non-Pauline letters plus Revelation. Luke is the recognized author of this book. This book continues the chronological account Luke started in his gospel account. Acts is the story of Jesus' final days including His ascension and the Great Commission. From there the story chronicles those who acted on these final words of Christ and spread the Good News of a risen Savior.

The development of the early church happened just as Jesus said it would. It started with Peter preaching to the Jews in Jerusalem. When the disciples met with opposition and were forced to flee from this great city, God prepared the way for their message in Judea and Samaria under the leadership of Philip. The apostle Paul spread the Word throughout the other countries when he went on three missionary journeys plus his final journey to Rome. (See the chart below for clarification of this transition.)

A long time ago ...

our Savior walked the earth performing miracles. Through these miracles he showed man who God was in him. This week we will look at four miracles Jesus performed. Next week we will look at four more miracles.

Jesus Calms the Storm

One day Jesus and his disciples decided to sail to the other side of the lake. While sailing, Jesus fell asleep. A squall came over the lake and the boat was in danger of being capsized. The disciples were afraid and woke up Jesus. He got up and spoke to the wind and the waters to calm the storm. When the storm subsided, he turned to his disciples and asked, "Where is your faith?"

Jesus Feeds 5000

The crowds followed Jesus wherever they went. They would spend hours listening to him teach. On one such occasion they were in a remote place far away from a village where they could get something to eat. The disciples approached Jesus and asked him to send the crowd away so they could find food and lodging. Instead Jesus replied, "You give them something to eat." (Luke 9:12) The disciples answered they did not have any food except five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus instructed them to tell the people to sit in groups of about fifty. He then took the food, gave thanks for it and broke it into smaller pieces. He told the disciples to distribute it among the people. All ate until they were full and there were twelve baskets full of broken pieces left over!

Jesus Cures a Man with Leprosy

Word spread throughout the land that Jesus healed people with just the touch of his hand. A man with covered with leprosy saw Jesus and fell on the ground in front of him saying, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean." (Luke 5:12) Jesus replied, "I am willing" and touched the man. The leprosy immediately disappeared.

Jesus Healed a Man who was Paralyzed

On another occasion, the Pharisees and law teachers came to Jesus to hear him teach. The room was crowded and many people stood outside the house in hopes of being healed by Jesus. Some men came carrying a friend who was paralyzed on a mat. They could not find a way into the house so they went up on the roof and lowered him on his mat through the tiles. When Jesus saw the faith of these men, he turned to the paralyzed man and told him his sins were forgiven. When Jesus said that, the Pharisees and teachers wondered to themselves who this man was who spoke blasphemy? Jesus knew what they were thinking. He said to them, "Why are you thinking these things in your heart? Which is easier to say, 'Your sins are forgiven', or to say, 'Get up and walk'?" (Luke 5:22) Jesus then turned to the paralyzed man, told him to get up, roll up his mat and go home.

What we can learn from these stories:

Jesus wanted to show the people God's power and love. He wanted to show them God cared about their needs. He showed his power over nature by calming the storm. He showed he cared about their needs by providing food for them when they were hungry. He also wanted to show them he had power over sickness by healing those who were sick.

God continues to show his power over nature and sickness by helping those He loves. He continues to provide for our daily needs by providing food and shelter when needed.





HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE

Jesus performed miracles to help people to understand who he was. He did miracles to prove he was sent by God and to show God's loving goodness.

The miracles Jesus performed can be broken down into four kinds. These four kinds are:

Miracles dealing with nature. Miracles dealing with healing. Miracles dealing with evil spirits. Miracles dealing with death.

Take a look at the miracles studied today. What two kinds do they represent? (Nature and sickness.) In the first miracle Jesus calms the storm showing his power over nature. Even though several of his disciples were experienced fishermen who had weathered many storms on the Sea of Galilee, this storm was especially sever causing even them to be afraid. Through this miracle Jesus taught the disciples to trust him in all situations no matter how dangerous. In the second miracle Jesus showed his concern for the basic human needs of the people by feeding five thousand men as well as women and children who had come to hear him preach. This miracle, too, was a miracle dealing with nature.

The last two miracles studied today were healing miracles. Jesus performed more healing miracles than any other kind. In the first one he healed a man with the dreaded skin disease of leprosy. In the second Jesus not performed the visible miracle of healing the man who was paralyzed, but also revealed to the pharisees and law teachers his true identity by showing his power as the Son of God to forgive sins.

BIBLE VERSE ERASER GAME

GRADES: 1-6

EQUIPMENT: 1 White Board

1 Eraser

OBJECTIVE: To memorize the Bible verse by the end of the game.

PRE-CLASS PREPARATION:

Write the Bible verse below on the white board.

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Have the class sit in front of the white board facing it.
- 2. Review the meaning of the verse.
- 3. Instruct the whole class to stand. Tell them to read the verse <u>three</u> times together out loud, then sit down.
- 4. Ask one player to erase one word.
- 5. Instruct the whole class to stand. Tell them to read the verse <u>once</u> out loud inserting the missing word, then sit.
- 6. Ask another player to erase one word.
- 7. Repeat steps #5 and #6 but instead of having the whole class stand, have the following groups of kids stand:

BIBLE LEARNING GAME:

BOAT TOSS


GRADES: 1-6

EQUIPMENT: 1 Table

OBJECTIVE: To stay "in the boat". The team with the most points wins.

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Divide the class into three teams ... A, B and C.
- 2. Have one player from each team sit on the table. Have one player from each team stand at each end of the table. The rest of the players stand by each side of the table and keep the players falling "out of the boat" from being hurt.
- 3. Time each "boat toss" for 20 seconds. Give a point to each team that still has a player "in the boat".
- 4. The team with the most points wins.



STAINED GLASS FISH

GRADES: 1-2

SUPPLIES: Wax Paper (9" x 12") Liquid Starch Paint Brushes Black Crayons Newspaper Tissue Paper Squares Construction Paper Scissors Glue

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. With a black crayon, instruct students to draw a large fish shape on the wax paper.
- 2. Cut out the fish shape and paint it with liquid starch.
- 3. Cover the fish shape with tissue paper "scales", overlapping as desired, adding starch as needed for the pieces to stick. Let it dry.
- 4. Glue on construction paper details such as eyes, mouth and fins.
- 5. Have children write the names of friends they would like to share Christ with on each "scale" of their fish.

This reminds students that they can be fishers of men, too.

ROLL-UPS


INGREDIENTS: Luncheon Slices Cheese Slices
