Illustrated Sermon "Blinded in Order to See"



Supplies needed: sunglasses, toy gun, chair, McDonalds bag

Preparation: Read acts 9:1-17

The Message:

Can someone tell me what a missionary is? (allow for response) That's right! A missionary is someone called by God to tell people about Jesus. Do you know anyone who is a missionary? I do. Did you know that you are a missionary? Yeah! You have been called by God to go tell others about Jesus. Jesus said in Mark 16:15 to "GO" into all the world and preach the Gospel. The word gospel means "Good news". For the next six weeks we will be looking at the life of one of the greatest missionaries ever— the Apostle Paul.

Today's story is about Paul, before he met Jesus. His name was Saul, Saul was a Pharisee. He was a religious leader who kept every law of the Jews. He dressed right. He looked right. He did everything right. But inside he was dirty. He hated Christians. He even tried to have them thrown in prison and even killed. He didn't like them for any other reason but because they were Christians. One day he was traveling on the road to Damascus when all of a sudden he saw a bright light shining down on him. (Pull out sunglasses and put them on) He probably wished he had some sunglasses like these but he didn't. He fell to the ground and heard a voice speaking. The voice was Jesus. He said, "Saul, why are you persecuting me?" Then Paul said, "who are you?" He said, "I am Jesus whom you are persecuting." When Saul got up, he was completely blind! He couldn't see a thing! The Bible says that for three days he didn't eat or drink anything. Then, God spoke to a man named Ananias and told him to go pray for Saul. When he did, Saul received his sight! Not only did he see again, he was changed on the inside by God! Saul was never the same after that moment. He ended up changing his name to Paul and he became one of the greatest missionaries ever! God used him to spread the Good News of Jesus all over the world. He was truly transformed by God so that God could use him.

There are three things that should happen when we have an encounter with Jesus:

1. SURRENDER TO GOD

The words 'surrender' means to give up. Saul fell to his knees and surrendered to Jesus that day on the road to Damascus. He gave up. He stopped doing the things that he wanted to do. And he totally surrendered his life to Jesus that day. Jesus gave him specific instructions and Saul did everything Jesus told him to do. If we are truly to be changed by Jesus, we have to completely surrender everything to him. (Pull out toy gun) If someone pulled a gun on me what do you think I would instantly do? I would immediately throw my hands up. (throw your hands up) This is the universal sign of surrender. This means that we are giving up and turning away from what we want and surrendering all that we have to what God wants for our lives. Surrendering to God means saying, "God I want your plans for my life, not my own."

2. SACRIFICE FOR GOD

We must be willing to give up some things to get closer to God. That's what the word sacrifice means. Saul was willing to give up his position as a Pharisee. He was willing to let go of his own dreams and desires to serve the Lord. (Stand up on the chair and have two volunteers come and stand on either side of you.) Now, let's imagine that standing on this chair is like living your life for God. If you get off the chair then you are not fully obeying God.

Now these two people here are my friends. (Hold hands with the person on your left and your right.) Now I can be friends with these two but what if they start pulling me down? (The volunteers start pulling gently) I can stay connected with them and eventually fall, or I can let go and stay on the chair. Sometimes we have things in our life that we are connected to, but if we stay connected, those things will pull us away from God.

3. SERVE GOD

When someone does something nice for you, you may want to do something for them. We should be willing to serve God as a sign that we have been truly changed. After Saul was prayed for by Ananias, he immediately went and started preaching in the synagogues. He was will willing to serve the Lord and do anything asked of him. (Pull out McDonalds bag.) How many of you have ever been to McDonalds? Have you ever gone through the drive through? What does the person say when you pull up to the speaker? (allow for response) They usually say "May I help you?" or "May I take your order?" That's when you give your order. Then, they usually read the order back to you to make sure it's right. Then you pull up to the window and get your food and usually it's exactly what you ordered. That's how we should be with God. When he comes to us we should say, "How may I serve you?"He will tell us what we should do then we should go and do it. So many people would rather be served than to serve. Jesus told us to serve others. That's why He got down one day and washed his disciples feet. He was being an example to us. Paul lived the rest of his life as a servant of God.

Prayer Time (Pray for the country of Romania)

Search your heart right now and see if you need to be changed by Jesus. You may look good on the outside, but let God examine you right now on the inside. Is there anything in you that needs to be changed? Our Main Word Verse says "Create in me a clean heart..." Let's ask Jesus to give us a clean heart right now.
