WEEK 1: No Doubt About It

NOTES: Print out Series Summary and hand a copy to each SG leader. Meet with SG leaders before the service and go over the big themes of the series, how to discipline, tickets/candy, offering.

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TEACH them

2nd Segment: (15 min. – Then turn over to small groups)

The intent with this section is to **tell the Bible story** in a compelling, animated, and interesting way. A good communicator uses the following script only as a guideline to speak, but never reading from it, as children can lose interest. Make the story come alive with voice inflections, funny anecdotes and noises, and passionate emotion. We intentionally give great latitude for the speaker to make it 'their own', using props, involving kids...whatever you can do to help the kids remember the Bible lesson.

BIBLE text

Judges 6:1-24 – Gideon Doubts

BEGIN speaking

Okay...so we doubt sometimes. Okay...so we are unsure of ourselves sometimes. The question is...what are you going to do about it?

After taking in all the information....after seeing that there's no reason to doubt, no reason to be gripped by fear....is it still okay to stay on the sidelines? What if God is clearly calling you to do something and your fear or doubt is keeping you from obeying God?

Let's take a look at a couple of quotes from some really wise people:

Show slide ("Quote 1")

Quote: "Any belief worth having must survive doubt."

Isn't that so true?! Any sports championship must survive pain and disappointment along the way. If you were to quit whenever you had a setback, you'd never experience victory. It's the same way with believing....the road to truth sometimes involves a little doubt along the way. But if you stayed at the point of doubting, you'd never experience believing.

Show slide ("Quote 2")

Here's another quote:

Quote: "Doubt is the beginning, not the end of wisdom."

What this quote is saying kids, is that when you starting questioning things more, it means you are really caring about the truth and what you really should believe in. It's the beginning of wisdom....it's the beginning of moving out from under your parent's faith and experiencing faith on your own. It's okay to have doubts...it's just not okay to stay there.

Show slide ("Judges 6:1-24")

And that's what we see in our Bible story today.

All month long, we're going to learn about Gideon. Now for those of you who've gone to church for a while, you might know the story of Gideon. Most of us have heard about how he wiped out a huge, powerful army with just a few hundred men. We're going to talk about that in a couple of weeks, but many of you may not have heard how it came to be that God chose Gideon to lead the Israelite army against the huge, powerful army of the Midianites.

SO, let's back up at bit to Judges, chapter 6, starting in verse 1. In order to understand where Gideon fits in the story, we have to find out what was happening with the Israelites first.

(Read (or have kids read) verses 1:10)

The Bible says that the Israelites did evil in the eyes of the Lord.

And so God allow the Midianites, who were these really tough people, to come through where the Israelites lived. They took all their food, and chased them out of their homes. They were not very nice, and they did this all the time.

When the Israelites cried out, the Lord sent a prophet who reminded them of how the Lord brought them up out of Egypt and slavery. He reminded them of the Lord's command to "not worship the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you live." But the Israelites did not listen to God and so God was allowing them to be pushed around by the Midianites.

God needed a leader for the Israelites, and so he sent an angel to a guy, named Gideon. Now Gideon was nothing special. He was the son of a guy named Joash. He was short and not particularly strong. He was just a regular guy, minding his own business.

Week 1 – Fearless (TRUST)

But the angel of the Lord appeared to Gideon, he said, "The Lord is with you, mighty warrior."

Gideon looks over his shoulder to see if the angel is talking to someone behind him. Gideon is like, "Who me? You must have me mixed up with someone else." (start to laugh hysterically and then suddenly stop laughing and get a fearful, confused look on your face).

Gideon, as it turns out, was a world-class, professional doubter. I mean, he was Chicken Little....asking questions and making excuses left and right.

"But sir," Gideon replied, "if the Lord is with us, why has all this happened to us?" Well, that's a fair question if the Israelites weren't disobeying God by worshiping other gods. Listen kids...God is a fair God...more than fair. But He can't reward us when we disobey. That would be like you disobeying your parents and because of it, they celebrated by taking you out for ice cream. It's just not going to happen.

But God did hear the cry of His people, and that is why He wanted Gideon to lead the army.

In verse 14, the Lord said, "Go in the strength you have and save Israel out of Midian's hand. Am I not sending you?"

But here goes Doubting Gideon again....

"But Lord, how can I save Israel? My clan is the weakest in Manasseh, and I am the least in my family." Gideon is like, "Ah Lord...have you looked at this body? I'm not (fingers in quotes) 'leadership' material. I'm just a little dude. My right big toe is longer than my left big toe, and I have this annoying mole on my left shoulder and my left eye twitches when I get nervous." (twitch your left eye)

Boy, Gideon just doesn't get it, does he? He's acting like he's the one in control. Remember Moses did that with God on the mountain with the burning bush, "Ah God, I can't speak very well, I can't do this, and I can't do that." But when God makes up His mind to use us, we don't really have much of a choice but to trust and obey.

So the Lord reminds Gideon, "I will be with you, and you will strike down all the Midianites together."

End of story right? Gideon's doubt is gone, right? Nope. 'OI Chicken Little Gideon has to open his mouth again, exposing all his fear and doubt. "If now I have found favor in your eyes, give me a sign that it is really you talking to me." Man! I think if God could roll His eyes, He'd be rolling His eyes at this little man.

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Poor doubting Gideon; poor Chicken Little. I don't know about you, but I sure don't want to be a doubter of God when He asks me to do something important for him. Instead, when He asks me to do something....even if it's hard or dangerous, or seemingly impossible....I want to be the one that says, "No Doubt About It! With God's help, we will do it!".

Trust is like a muscle...we have to work it out to make it stronger. Have you ever had a broken arm or leg and had to have a cast put on? No fun! And then after several weeks, the doctor takes the cast off and all you have is this little tiny, flabby, good-for-nothing muscle. Why? Because you haven't used it; you haven't worked it out.

Kids, we have to work out our trust muscle and our faith muscle by listening and obeying God. Don't let your fears and your doubts get in the way of following God. He will guide you along the path and will always be with you. Your job is just to listen, to trust and follow through with what He's asking you to do. Okay?

EVALUATE their understanding

Okay kids...let's huddle up and face your small group leaders. Small group leaders, go through the **STEP 2 - EVALUATE** section on your small group leader sheet with your kids.

(While small groups are going, use this time to check your notes, reset your props, and walk around to some of the groups and listen to how it's going.)

CHALLENGE them

3rd Segment: (5 min. – Then turn over to small groups)

The intent with this section is to **encourage and challenge the kids** to take a spiritual step forward this week. We want them to stop and think, make better choices, form new habits and bring God into their everyday world. This is a great time to speak from your heart and then pray for them.

BEGIN speaking

Kids, as you get older, you'll have more questions about God, who He is and how He fits into your everyday world, and most importantly....how you fit into His plans for mankind.

It's okay to doubt God sometimes, but don't stay there. Ask questions about God for the purpose of knowing Him better. Usually when we doubt God, it's because we still need to understand who He really is.

Remember....**doubt is the beginning, not the end, of wisdom**. When you start asking good questions about God, it means that your faith is really coming alive! And ALL the things that you've been taught are now becoming real and more important to you.

Show slide ("Take-Away Point")

Let's remember our Take-Away Point today: "God has never given us a reason to doubt Him". Let's say together. (repeat the Take-Away Point together). Awesome job!

I pray that God will show where to find your answers in the Bible. The Bible is God's guidebook to life.

Let's pray.

Show slide ("Take-Away Point")

Our Action Hero, Trustina, reminds us in our Take-Away Point that: **"God has never given us a reason to doubt Him."** Let's say together. (Repeat the Take-Away Point together). As we have talked about, Trustina wears eye glasses because she's blind. I'm sure Trustina has doubts her safety whenever she crosses the street, I'm sure she doubts that she can get from her home to work. Trustina needs the help of others, and she needs certain tools to get around. But have you ever thought about the advantages of being blind? There's a lot of bad things to see in this world. Being blind means that you don't struggle with having to see something to believe; you just have

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faith that it's there. Trustina doesn't struggle with fear and doubt, because she knows that the people around her love her and will care for her. They don't feel sorry for her; it's out of love for her that causes them to lend a hand.

That's the way it is with God. He knows that we are all blind; blind to the truth, blind to what is right and what is wrong, and blind to many other things. We just don't see it... we just don't get it. Well, God doesn't leave just sitting there with no ability to see. As our faith and trust in Him grows, He shows us new things that we missed before. He gives us wisdom to make good decisions. Without God in our lives, we are all blind. But with Him, we are able to see things, see the world, and see people in a whole new and fresh way.

Show slide ("Spotlight Verse")

Say the Spotlight Verse with me: **"We know how much God loves us, and we have put our trust in His love."** 1 John 4:16 (NLT)

Let's Pray: "Dear God, sometimes we doubt things, we doubt ourselves and we doubt You. Sometimes we forget that we were created in your image, and we were made to love You and to serve You Only. God, I pray for each of these kids that they would grow up to know You is a very cool way. Help them to see that they are nothing and can do nothing apart from You. All of our power, all of our strength, and all of our love comes from You. You get the victory for the success in our lives. As we learn about Gideon this month, show us what are to learn through his story of changing from doubt to trust. It's in the name of Jesus we pray. Amen."

Great job! Have an amazing week trusting God for all things!

ENCOURAGE their walk
